

Allocating String Space

At the very start of your program right after the SCREEN BEGIN statement, use the Pseudocode STRINGS: ALLOCATE n BYTES OF STRING SPACE.

For n, use 1024. This effectively creates the statement CLEAR 1024 in your program. (See BASIC User's Guide for more information on this command.)

Note that the default string space is 512 bytes. Before and after the program termination, this value will always be restored. Therefore, string space should be changed only at the beginning of a program.
